NEWS FROM REVD LUKE

Dear friends,

By the time you read this I will be on my sabbatical. A sabbatical is a gift granted to ministers in the active work every 7 years.

The Methodist Church website says this, "Sabbaticals are a required part of a presbyter's or deacon's performance of his or her duties They can be extremely beneficial both for the individual minister and for the health of the wider Church and can significantly enhance the ministry of the whole people of God.

For Methodist presbyters and deacons, a sabbatical is a period of release from ordinary ministerial duties, in addition to normal holidays, for the purpose of pursuing an approved programme of study, research, work or experience. It is intended as a time for re-equipping, refreshment and renewal.

All presbyters and deacons in Full Connexion and stationed in an appointment within the control of the Church are expected to take a regular sabbatical".

The aims of my sabbatical (from 6th January to 12th April) are to Pause, Pray and Prepare.

I am currently in my 24th year of ministry with approximately 13 years before I seek permission to sit down so I am about 2/3rds of my way through active ministry. To be honest, I feel tired and need to take stock. I hope to reflect on my experiences and prayerfully consider how I approach my next appointment. I really want to discern Gods will in my role as a presbyter. In the past I have enjoyed study, but felt there wasn't time in this appointment.

More specifically I need to:

Pause – this will be achieved by spending 2 weeks on the island of Liung in Scotland. I have never been before. I am happiest when I'm with Vivienne and Toffee, so they will be with me. Its **pause** not stop, so I would like to reflect on my past and the past of others so I will complete the cliff college Church History course

I will also pray – I intend worshipping in churches where I am unknown and I'm free to worship, some of this will be when I'm in Scotland (I will travel to Iona) but may be in Lincolnshire or at the parish church near where we have our own property.

Having spent time pausing and praying I anticipate I will be able to **prepare** for whatever lies ahead. Approach the new appointment refreshed and energised.

I hope to return re-energised and enthused about what God has in store for me in the next stage of service.

Sunday: 9.00 a.m. Informal Worship, with Breakfast Fellowship the 2nd Sunday of each month.

10.30 a.m. Morning Service

Monday: Welcome Space - Hall 10.00 a.m. - 2.00 p.m.

About 30-40+ people are regularly welcomed and fed, including some who are homeless. Chat is important for some who are lonely. A warm rail is used in the winter months. Helpers are caring for the guests in a friendly way in a safe space.

Tuesday: Coffee Morning - Hall 10.00 a.m. - noon

Shoppers' Service - Church 10.45 a.m. – 11.00 a.m. The popular gettogether of members and friends with a time for worship too.

1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month: Midweekers 2.00 p.m. - 4.00 p.m. A meeting which enjoys a varied program of devotional and participation activities, as well as guest speakers. There is an occasional afternoon outing.

2nd Wednesday of each month Luncheon Club, noon - 2.00 p.m. A 3-course meal for a donation of £6. Booking essential. Good company for those who attend.

4th Wednesday of each month: Four Seasons, 2.00 p.m. - 4.00 p.m.

About 20 people come along to play dominoes, scrabble and more recently cribbage. Many of the people who come live on their own and they enjoy the company, friendship, chatter and laughter. We do have fun. If you'd like to come along, you'd be very welcome. We have tea or coffee, biscuits and /or cake and we go out for lunch two or three times a year. You don't have to be an expert at the games, just come along for a chat and a drink.

Thursday: Family Play 12.30 p.m. – 2.30 p.m. For babies and pre-school children in the lovely Church and lounge area. Older siblings came during the school holiday in May.

1st Thursday of each month: Prayer Meeting, 6.00 p.m. -7.00 p.m. All welcome, your presence is all that is needed, prayers can be silent, read out, or spontaneous.

Friday: Knit and Natter 10.00 a.m. - noon. A group busy providing articles of clothing and blankets for those in dire need in Armenia. An invitation to just come along for a chat if you can't knit or crochet.

3rd **Saturday of each month:** Messy Church. For all ages, run by our Youth and Community worker to include various activities with a Bible basis.
